ORDER:

All the Heads of Secondary Schools in the State are hereby informed that the Secondary School Certificates along with scanned photos (Pass-cum-Grade Points) of the passed candidates of SSC/OSSC/Vocational Public Examinations, held in March-2024 and ASE June-2024 are sent herewith to all schools along with the annexure showing the details, by Speed Post. The receipt of the above SSC/OSSC/Vocational pass certificates along with the annexure should be acknowledged by next post duly furnishing the Roll Numbers of candidates whose certificates have not been received if any, with reference to the candidates particulars submitted through online forwarded by you, so that the same may arranged to be sent to you. The acknowledgement should be furnished to this office in the Proforma appended to the name address of the Additional Joint Secretary concerned.

The following instructions should be strictly adhered-to, before issuing the Pass Certificates to the candidates:

1. The entries relating to the personal marks of identification have also been got printed in the SSC/OSSC/Vocational Pass Certificates to the extent furnished in the online application submission of respective candidates. These entries should invariably be checked by the concerned Heads of Institutions carefully with reference to the entries made in the school admission register before issuing the certificates to the candidates. The Heads of Institution should also sign underneath the certificate on the left-hand side, duly affixing designation stamp without fail.
2. If the entries relating to the marks of identification of the candidate have not got printed in the SSC/OSSC/Vocational Pass Certificates the Headmaster should write the marks of identification of the respective candidate in the SSC/OSSC/Vocational

with reference to the admission register and the same may be informed to the Director of Government Examinations, Telangana, Hyderabad, if any corrections occurred in marks of identifications of the candidates, the Headmaster concerned should submit a certificate to this office declaring that the particulars of the identification marks submitted here under with reference to admission register are "true and best of my knowledge."

3. As per Memo.No.10047/SE-Prog.I /A2/2023 dated: 08-11-2023, the Government here by accord permission to the Director of School Education, Telangana, Hyderabad/the Director, State Project Director, Samagra Shiksha, Telangana, Hyderabad to print the Permanent Education Number (PEN) of the students on the SSC Hall ticket and SSC Memo from the academic year 2023-2024 onwards under all managements in the State and making it mandatory to record the student PEN in the admission registers. The entry of the PEN in the SSC Pass Certificate should be verified by the Headmaster with admission register invariably. If the PEN number is not printed or misprinted in the SSC certificate, the certificate may be returned to this office through the Headmaster concerned.
4. The entries relating to the Name and address of the school printed in the SSC/OSSC/Vocational Pass Certificates should be checked by the Headmaster before issuing the certificate. If any error is found the Headmaster should return the certificates along with the copy of ETR/Proceedings of the RJDSE concerned to the DGE, TS, Hyderabad for rectification of the error and brought to the notice of the Director of Government Examinations, Telangana, Hyderabad with in the eight (8) working days from the date of receipt of the pass certificates.
5. In the office records maintained by the schools, the year and month of the Public Examination, Marks, Results and the serial number of the certificates should be noted in respect of each candidate.
6. On receipt of unconcerned pass certificates of the candidates who do not belong to your school, those SSC/OSSC/Vocational should be returned to the name address of the Additional Joint Secretary concerned immediately by registered post with acknowledgement due with a separate covering letter addressed to the Additional Joint Secretaries.
7. Pass certificates in respect of Children with Special Needs (CwSN) are to be verified as per G.O.Ms.No.27, School Education (Prog.II) Dept., Dt:07-11-2022 and G.O.Ms.No.12, School Education (Prog.II) Dept., Dt: 09-03-2023 providing certain exemptions & concessions and minimum pass marks in the SSC Public Examinations April 2023 onwards. All the Heads of Institutions are instructed to return the Secondary School Certificate of such candidates which were found not correct w.r.f to said G.O. for revising and issuing fresh certificates.
 - i. CwSN category of 6,7,8,9 & 20 are exempted from studying& appearing in any one language out of three languages and 35% is the pass marks for all subjects except second language and 20% is the pass marks for second language.
 - ii. CwSN candidates of 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 14, 15 & 19 are exempted from studying& appearing in any one language out of three languages and 20% is the pass marks for all subjects.
 - iii. As per G.O.Ms.No.12, School Education (Prog.II) Dept., Dt: 09-03-2023, the CwSN candidates of 10 & 11 may opt to study and write all (03) languages (or) avail exemption from studying & writing any one language out of the three and 20% is the pass marks for all subjects.

- iv. CwSN candidates of 12 & 13 are permitted to study & write only one language subject out of the three (Any 2 languages are exempted) and 20% is the pass marks for all subjects.
 - v. CwSN category of 16 & 18 are exempted from studying & writing any one of language subject out of the three languages and 10% is the pass marks for all subjects.
 - vi. CwSN category of 17 are permitted to study & write only one language subject out of the three (Any 2 languages are exempted) and 10% is the pass marks for all subjects.
8. Before issuing pass certificates, the Headmasters have to verify whether the under aged candidates have been accorded condonation of age to the extent required by the competent authority, if not the certificates of the candidates may be retained with them and after obtaining proper orders of condonation of age only the certificates / Memos have to be issued to the concerned.

SSC PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS MARCH-2024 AND ADVANCED SUPPLEMENTARY
EXAMINATIONS JUNE-2024
RULES OF ELIGIBILITY

- A. It is informed that as per the G.O.Rt.No.592, Secondary Education (Prog.I) Department, dated: 23-10-2009 for introducing of Grading System in SSC/OSSC Public Examinations, March 2010 onwards. The Government in their subsequent G.O.Rt.No.419, Education (PE.SER.II) Department, Dated:17-05-2011 have issued orders on implementation of Grading System in the SSC/OSSC.
- B. It is also informed that the Government vide their GOs under reference from 3rd to 6th cited have issued orders to implement the "Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation" (CCE) and curricular reforms based on National Curriculum Frame work 2005 in the State and also issued instructions to follow New Examination Pattern, revised syllabus and text books in the X class and added Co-curricular activities of the students in a phased manner. Accordingly the SSC Public Examinations March-2024 and ASE June-2024 were conducted.
- C. Grading system for SSC Public Examinations, March-2024 for Regular and Private Candidates (once failed).
In the SSC Public Examinations, March-2024 also marks are not provided in the performance statements or pass certificates. Only subject wise Grades along with Grade points assigned to it and Cumulative Grade Point Average is shown in the certificates or performance statements.
- D. Formative Assessment (Internal Marks) and Summative Assessment (External Marks) :-
As per orders of the Government in G.Os under reference 3rd to 6th cited, the result of the candidates are decided based on the following condition as mentioned in Table-1 and Grades are awarded to the candidates in Formative Assessment and Summative Assessment as per table-1.

The details of papers and maximum marks for Regular general category of students are as follow

- i. The Government vide G.O.Ms No.33 School Education (Prog-II) Department Dt: 28-12-2022, the Government here by accord permission to conduct SSC Public Examinations with 06 papers instead of 11 papers.
 - ii. There will be no change in the existing weightage of marks i.e., 80 marks for final examination (Board Exam) and 20 marks for Formative Assessments for all 06 subjects.
 - iii. There is no change in the marks pattern of composite courses such as 03T/04S, 03U/05 and 03U/08H.
 - iv. There is no change in the marks pattern of OSSC/Vocational courses.
 - v. 35% is the pass marks for all the subjects. However, the candidates must secure at least 28 marks out of 80 marks in First Language, Third Language and Non-Languages in Summative Assessment (SA) to pass in every subject.
 - vi. The Government vide G.O.Ms No.10 School Education (Prog-II) Department Dt: 26-11-2014, 20% is the pass marks for Second Language. However, the candidates must secure at least 16 marks out of 80 in Summative Assessment (SA) to pass in second Language.
 - vii. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is the arithmetic average of subject wise Grade Points.
 - viii. Government have issued orders to restore the composite courses from the academic year 2016-17 onwards vide their G.O.Ms.No.06 School Education (Prog,II) Dept., dt:17-02-2016.
- E. Co-Curricular Subject: As per the G.O.Ms.No.17, Dt: 14-05-2014 in Co-Curricular Areas Grades are awarded based on the following Academic Standards. Grade, Grade Range and Grade points are shown in Table No.2

Basing on the above table the Grades and Grade Points are awarded to all the passed candidates.

- G. For every subject Grades and Grade Points are shown in the pass certificate. Separate Grades are shown for OSSC, CwSN and physically challenged (once failed), category of candidates, since there is an exemption for them from appearing in some subjects.
- H. Grading system table is printed on the reverse side of each category of certificate i.e., SSC, OSSC, and PH.
- I. All the candidates securing less than 35 marks are considered failed and awarded E-Grade. Candidates securing an aggregate grade of 'E' will not be issued any certificate.
- J. For every subject, Grades and Grade Points are shown in the Pass certificate along with Co-curricular activities.
- K. Statements of performance are issued to all the candidates who appear for SSC examinations irrespective of CGPA they secure.

**OSSC PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS MARCH-2024 AND ADVANCED SUPPLEMENTARY
EXAMINATIONS JUNE-2024**

RULES OF ELIGIBILITY

1. The following is the OSSC pattern as per the three language formula:

(23/24) Sanskrit (80+80=160 Marks)	Telugu (80 Marks)	Hindi (09H) (80 Marks)	English (80 Marks)

2. **Non-Language subjects**: The student under OSSC can opt for any two of the three non-language subjects. But, it is enough if the candidate gets pass marks in one subject.
3. 35% is the pass marks for Oriental Language. However, the candidates must secure atleast 56 marks out of 160 marks in SA to pass in Oriental Language.

SSC & OSSC PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS MARCH-2024

RULES OF ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPARTMENTAL (Private once failed) PASSED CANDIDATES

COMPARTMENTAL PASSED CANDIDATES: Grades and Grade points are shown to the once failed candidates with star mark for their previously secured Grades and compartmental pass certificates will be issued to them by following the procedure in vogue.

PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED CANDIDATES (ONCE FAILED):

- i) Pass certificates in respect of Physically Handicapped Candidates for certain exemptions as per G.O.Ms.No.33 Edn. (Exams) Dept., dt:19-03-2001, as follows:
- a) PH (I) (Hearing Impaired) candidates to study only one language exemption for any two languages.
 - b) Whereas for PH (I) & PH (II) (Visual Impaired) category of students 20% is the pass marks for all subjects.
- ii). Certain exemption for (PH IV) (Dyslexia) candidates as per G.O.Ms.No.34 Education (SE-Exams) Department Dated: 05-03-2004 are as follows:
- a. 35% is the pass marks for all the subjects, except 2nd Language,
 - b. 20% is the pass marks for 2nd Language,
 - c. Exemption for writing 3rd Language.
